



Dear Parent/ Carer

World Book Day - Thursday 8th March

This year we have decided to have a whole school focus on Drew Daywalt's excellent book called 'The Day the Crayons Quit' which is also one of the KS1 Reading Challenge books, so some children may already know of it.

In the story 'poor Duncan just wants to colour in. But when he opens his box of crayons, he only finds letters, all saying the same thing: We quit! Beige is tired of playing second fiddle to Brown, Blue needs a break from colouring in all that water, while Pink just wants to be used. Green has no complaints, but Orange and Yellow are no longer speaking to each other. The battle lines have been drawn. What is Duncan to do?...'

Instead of dressing up as a book character this year, we would like to ask the children to partly dress in one of the colours of the crayons which has been assigned to their class. However we do appreciate some of the colours may not be easy to find in your child's wardrobe and we don't want this to become a costly activity. Therefore a touch of that colour on a T-Shirt or jumper with their normal jeans or trousers would be absolutely fine.
