

Sports Premium Funding at Aire View Infant School: 2013-2017

What is the Sports Premium?

The government has renewed additional funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013-2014, 2014-2015, 2015-2016 and 2016-2017 to improve provision of physical education and sport in primary schools and promote healthy lifestyles. This funding is provided jointly by the Department for Education, Health and Culture, and Media and Sport. The funding is ring-fenced and therefore has to be spent on provision for PE and sport in schools. Schools have the freedom to choose how to use the money improve their provision of PE and sport and to provide the health and wellbeing of all pupils. We were allocated £8,715 for the academic year 2013-2014, £8,740 for the academic year 2014-2015, £8,750 for the academic year 2015-2016 and £8,770 for the academic year 2016-2017.
