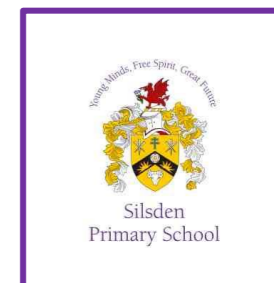

Units are planned to fit with other curriculum learning and times of year. Key objectives of units made clear for children in topic books. Topic launch and review sheets allow children to self-assess prior, and gained, knowledge. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Topic information displayed in classrooms, including key vocabulary. Topic launch and review sheets allow children to record key facts. Curriculum quiz – summer term house competition (new for 2021). Home learning opportunities to develop knowledge further. Central history timeline and vocabulary display (new building, Sep 2021). 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Topic units that provide opportunities to link history with geography, art & design and DT. Where possible, links are made to English, maths, science, computing, music and PE. Opportunities for longer written responses (KS2). Opportunities to deepen (local area) historical knowledge via day trips (e.g. Skipton Castle Y2, Brigantium Roman Fort Y3, Industrial Museum Y5) and experience days (e.g. Viking Day Y4, Evacuee Day Y6). 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Everyone has access to the Geography National Curriculum. Some pupils learn key history ideas in groups/settings suitable to their needs (e.g. small groups, 1:1). Financial support (PP) allows access to day trips for ALL children. Activities and display materials for units from Cornerstones Education.
