- Imagine you are the captain of a pirate ship: write your own job advert for a pirate on your ship.

- Design and make a pirate puppet.
- Make a delicious treasure map pizza, don't forget X marks the spot. Aaar! (Don't forget to send in a photo to show your class.)
- Create a wanted poster to help capture a dangerous pirate.
- Create your own pirate hat, to help you become a real-life pirate. Can you create a matching eye-patch too?
