Year 2 Learning Leaflet

Street Detectives - Silsden

Our topic this term is 'Street Detectives'. We will be learning about our local community, looking at houses old and new and finding out how our streets have changed since our parents were young. Perhaps your Granny or Grandpa went to Silsden Primary School or maybe they worked in a local shop? We will make maps and plans of the streets around us, planning our routes, looking at where we live and learning how to write our own address. We will then go on an adventure into Silsden to have a look at how it has changed over the years.

<u>Science</u>

As **Scientists**, the children are going to be consolidating their learning of Living Things and their Habitats in preparation of our Nell Bank visit. We will look at the different habitats that can be found around the world before the children create their own habitat.

<u>Maths</u>

This half term we are starting off by recapping shapes, introducing vertices and symmetry and studying 3D shapes. We will use what we have learnt to explore 3D shapes and count the faces, vertices and edges of them.

We will then move on to learning about money, counting pounds and pence, comparing money and explore giving change.

The final part of the half term will be introducing multiplication and division problems, recognising equal groups and patterns in children's work.

We will continue to recap the skills taught last term and pre-teach future skills in arithmetic lessons.

<u>English</u>

We are going to create a forest school shop and the children are going to purchase items to build their own habitat.
