In addition, we will offer all children the chance to listen to a book being read by an adult in school. We hope to offer children a wide choice of books and the opportunity to hear a different adult read to them.

Please encourage your child to read as much as possible during World Book Day week. To help promote this, we will be holding a Book Fair after school from 25th February to the 5th March.

On World Book Day we will be holding the 'Great Book Swap' where we ask children to bring in a book to swap within their Year Group on the day. This book should be one that they are prepared to give away, and it should be in good condition. Your child will then come home with a new book which will also be of good quality and hopefully one that your child can't wait to read!
